ONE-STOP WORKSHOP

Carpenters Workshop Gallery was founded in 2006 by gallerist Julien Lombrail (left) and art dealer Loïc Le Gaillard. The gallery specialises in contemporary design aimed at the collectors' market and has worked with creatives as diverse as late fashion designer Karl Lagerfeld, artist Yinka Shonibare and furniture designer Maarten Baas. Following a four-year renovation spearheaded by architect Sir David Adjaye, the gallery has moved its London headquarters from Albemarle Street, W1, to Ladbroke Hall, W10. This is a large listed building that Loïc and Julien have set up as an immersive cultural hub. 'I wanted the space to celebrate all forms of artistic expression,' explains Julien, who is as excited about the restaurant headed up by chef Emanuele Pollini and the 100-seat theatre as he is about their exhibition programme. Currently, Sir David's bronze furniture can be seen in one of the gallery spaces and, next month, contemporary pieces by Italian designer Vincenzo de Cotiis will be on show. *Ladbroke Hall, Barlby Road, W10: ladbrokehall.com | carpentersworkshopgallery.com* ▷
